## In the Spotlight...



Last week I had one of the absolute best days of my 14-year SFS career - I had the great privilege of shadowing a 2nd Grade student from drop off until pick up.

For those of you who are not aware, this past January, SFS embarked on a year-long Schedule Redesign process. Under the guidance of a firm called **Leadership+Design**, we convened a committee of thirteen faculty and administrators to reimagine our schedule from preschool through 8th grade. Our plan is to reveal our new schedule in January of 2019 (to be put in place for the fall of 2019). However, we are prototyping small tweaks to our existing schedule already as we truly hope to make an impact that serves our students as soon as possible with this process.

As part of our Schedule Redesign process, committee members are taking an empathy-based approach. What that means in this case is that each committee member, plus me, shadows an individual student for an entire day (spanning all of the grades). This will give us an opportunity to gain insights from the perspective of the lived experience of our most important "users" - our students. In becoming anthropologists in our own school, we are gaining an understanding of a student's day from start to finish, allowing us to gather stories and snapshots that will

ultimately help us frame student needs and opportunities for growth while creating our new schedule.

### **School News**

### **Division Head Rebalance for 2018-19**

We have decided to rebalance the Division Head positions starting July 1, 2018. After that date, Maggie Weis's title will be the Lower School Head and she will oversee PS – 3rd Grades. Nancy Nagramada will be the Upper School Head, and she will oversee 4th – 8th Grades. Student, staff, parent/guardian, and program oversight will fall along this divide. However, it is important to note that the 4th and 5th Grades will still be a part of the overall elementary program. We made this decision for a number of reasons:

- Allows for a better balance of students, staff, and families between two positions
- Social-emotional alignment and activities usually coincide with 4th-8th grade (i.e., Health education and other SEL matters)
- Impact of technology/social media on student life is more aligned (iPads introduced in 4th grade, many students get first phones/iPods in the upper elementary or middle school years, etc.)
- MAP testing begins in 4th grade
- Introduction of a 4th/5th grade math and science teacher next year is better aligned with program structure in MS

We may find that there are more ways in which these grades align as the year progresses. We continue to solve for several matters that come with this change; for example, what impact this realignment might have on classroom spaces. With touch screens as a constant source of entertainment and distraction, families have a tougher time than ever figuring out how to raise healthy children.
